### BOOST FOR HALL FUND

**A**N engineless vehicle fancy dress competition is being held at the annual Tenterden Fair, organised by the youth club. The aim is to give every family in the town a contest which they can enter.

This will be the third fair organised by the club and as before profits will go to cut down the debt on the building used by the club and the town's association for the care of the elderly.

The first fair raised £250, last year there was a profit of £350 and the organisers are hoping that this year's event will see an even higher figure recorded.

New to the programme are the fancy dress competitions and a garden centre. Letters have been sent to nurseries within a wide radius of Tenterden explaining that it is planned to have a centre at the fair, to be held on September 2, where surplus plants, seeds, produce and garden sundries will be sold.

Two items which have been dropped from the programme are the parade of floats and tossing the hay.
