The Tonbridge club has proved a highly successful venture over 3 years and now has 260 members. Tenterden Youth Club is just over three months old and has 120 members.

Contact between the two clubs was established through the county youth organisation and the Tenterden officials went to Tonbridge by invitation of the Teen and Twenty Club leader, Mr. Les Scott.

The Tenterden visitors saw members enjoying judo and wrestling, basketball and bar billiards and were impressed by the fact the Tonbridge youngsters run a monthly dance and carry on many outside activities.

At Tenterden it is hoped to begin judo lessons this month. After three months of organisation the special judo mat should arrive soon, and Mr. Lockhead of Biddenden has offered to give instruction. He is the holder of a brown belt.

The Tenterden club is also considering organising activities with other youth clubs and has ideas for regular dances. Mr. Miller said a bar billiards table similar to the one that has proved successful at Tonbridge would be valuable to his club.

He thought that on the whole the Tenterden club could copy most of the Tonbridge club's activities. Basketball might be arranged at Homewood School in Tenterden.

Meanwhile the link between the two clubs was further forged on Wednesday night, when a team of Tonbridge wrestlers gave a demonstration at Tenterden Drill Hall where the club meets.
