B2080 BEACON OAK ROAD, TENTERDEN

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow works to be carried out to construct a new roundabout at the junction with A28 Ashford Road, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of B2080 Beacon Oak Road, Tenterden, and to impose traffic restrictions on nearby roads.

Traffic restrictions come into force from Monday 11 January 2021 and remain in force until works are finished, with estimated completion by 12 April 2021.

B2080 Beacon Oak Road will be closed in the general vicinity of the junction with A28 Ashford Road, to the extent shown on site.

The alternative routes for through traffic are as follows

Southbound via A28 Ashford Road, B2067 Oaks Road and Golden Square

Northbound via B2080 Appledore Road, B2067 East Hill, Oaks Road and A28 Ashford Road

A temporary One-way Traffic system will be imposed on Golden Square and East Hill as follows

- B2067 Golden Square will become one-way *eastbound* only
- B2067 East Hill will become one-way *westbound* only

Local access to properties in Beacon Oak Road continues from southern direction.

A temporary signalised pedestrian crossing will be created on B2067 Oaks Road between the junctions with Sandy Lane and Elmfield.

The restrictions are in conjunction with temporary traffic lights on A28 Ashford Road.

Due to the nature of the works, all restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.

Waiting and loading will be prohibited at all times on both sides of B2067 Oaks Road for its entire length, to the extent indicated by temporary double yellow lines on site.

Waiting and loading will be prohibited at all times on both sides of B2067 Woodchurch Road between the junctions with Beacon Oak Road and Mount Pleasant, to the actual extent clearly extent indicated on site.

This Order over-rides any existing parking entitlements and restrictions that apply to the sections of Oaks Road and Woodchurch Road defined in the 2 previous paragraphs.

The planned dates and duration may change for various reasons including the current coronavirus situation, and updated information can be found on www.one.network – [Walker Construction Ltd Permit GE27897722851], with any changes signposted on site and notified locally.
